#### **Qualification: Occupational Certificate: Child and Youth Care Worker**

#### **Course Description:**

The purpose of this qualification is to prepare a learner to operate as a Child and Youth Care Worker. A Child and Youth Care Worker contributes to the provision of holistic therapeutic care, and supports the development of children and youth in order to ensure the appropriate development of the individuals through the application of professional life space interventions.

A qualified student will be able to:

- Provide holistic, basic and developmental care for orphaned, vulnerable and at risk children and youth.
- Apply behaviour management and support techniques in routine child and youth care contexts.
- Implement life space work and life space counselling.
- Maintain planned environments in child and youth care work.
- Participate in developmental assessment of children and youth.
- Assist with the implementation of programmes and activities to deal with identified needs.
- Advocate for the rights of children and youth.
- Undertake basic Child and Youth care administration.

#### **Career Opportunities:**

With this qualification, successful students could pursue a career as Child and Youth Care Worker and can be employed at NGO's, FBO's, community based organizations and government departments.

#### **Duration and Mode:**

The programme will be presented residentially over a period of one year.



The theoretical (knowledge) and practical skills component of the course will be offered on the main campus of the College in Wellington. The workplaces for the workplace experience component will, as far as possible, be arranged in a community most convenient for the student. Students need to complete the workplace experience component under the supervision of a registered social worker.

At the end of the training, the student will be assessed externally by the External Integrated Summative Assessment (EISA). The Quality Council for Trades and Occupations (QCTO) will conduct this assessment and successful students will receive their certificates from this quality assurance body.

### **Admission Requirements:**

- The minimum entry requirement for this qualification is a NQF Level 3 qualification / Grade 11 with communication
- RPL for access to the qualification: Accredited providers and approved workplaces may recognise prior learning against the relevant access requirements.

### **Please Note:**

No person with a criminal or child abuse record will be considered for admission to this programme as they will not be able to register as social auxiliary workers at the SACSSP during and after the completion of their studies.
